Flying In?



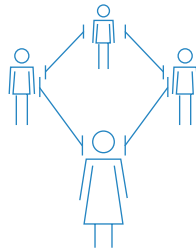
Research shows that aircraft are unlikely places for the transmission of viruses like COVID-19. Once you've landed, you'll be welcomed at newly remodeled Clinton National Airport. The airport has implemented safety measures that include increased frequency of cleaning and sanitizing of high contact areas, ensuring high traffic areas are frequently maintained and janitorial staff is following best practices. There are also additional hand sanitizing stations throughout the terminal and near information counters.

Onsite communications have been updated to include print and digital signage in public areas reminding guests of important hygiene measures and physical distancing.



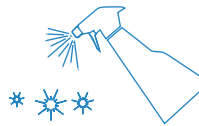
Capacity charts for all exhibit halls, ballrooms, meeting rooms and the performance hall will be revised to allow for physical distancing standards.

All public areas will be configured to include wider aisles and orderly queues where needed.

Where possible, public access doors will be designated as either entrance or exit only to limit cross pedestrian traffic and personal contact.



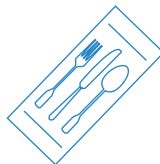

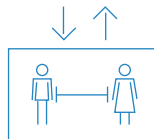
